

**CITY OF FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS**  
**PROCLAMATION BY THE MAYOR**  
**EXTENDING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER**  
**ISSUED ON JUNE 29, 2020, RELATING TO WEARING OF FACE**  
**COVERINGS AT COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC**

**DATE ISSUED: September 28, 2020**

**WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, Governor Greg Abbott declared a State of Disaster for all 254 Counties in the State of Texas; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 19, 2020, Mayor Linda Langerhans, under the authority of state law, city charter, and local ordinance, issued a Declaration of Local State of Disaster in response to this public health emergency, that was extended by the City Council on March 23, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 19, 2020, Gillespie County Judge Mark Stroehler issued a Declaration of Local State of Disaster due to a public health emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, scientific evidence indicates that COVID-19 is a highly communicable disease that has affected people to varying degrees, and has the potential to affect a significant portion of the local population, placing increased persons at risk for serious health complications, resulting in hospitalization and possibly death; and


**WHEREAS**, I, Gary Neffendorf, Mayor of the City of Fredericksburg, Texas, issued a Supplemental Order on June 29th, 2020, and extended said Order on August 10, 2020, related to the wearing of face coverings and requiring Health and Safety Policies for all Commercial Entities; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, the Mayor is designated as the Emergency Management Director of the City of Fredericksburg, and may exercise the powers granted to the Governor of Texas on an appropriate local scale.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS**, that Section 2 of the *Supplemental Order Relating to Mandatory Wearing of Face Coverings at Commercial Establishments Open to the Public* issued on June 29, 2020, and extended on August 10, 2020, is hereby amended, effective immediately, to read as follows:


“Section 2. **Declaration and Duration of Emergency Order.** The regulations in this emergency order shall take effect immediately upon execution and shall remain in full force and effect until November 2, 2020, unless extended, modified, or terminated by the City Council, or if superseded by order of the County Judge or the Governor of Texas. The decisions to extend, modify, or terminate this Order will take into consideration recommendations from local public health officials among other factors related to improved local conditions.”
